The Clark County Manufacturing Collaborative (CCMC) is for individuals interested in getting or advancing their skills in one of four high-demand areas of manufacturing. Right now, there are hundreds of jobs going unfilled in Clark County for:

- Manufacturing Laborers
- Basic Machining
- Precision Machining
- Advanced Machining

For selected participants, this program will cover the costs of manufacturing skill upgrade training and nationally recognized manufacturing credentials that employers require of new hires.

Eligible training participants include low-income adults and dislocated workers.

General Eligibility Requirements – Adult and Dislocated Worker:

- 18 Years of age or older
- Authorized to work in the United States
- Meet low-income guidelines of the Workforce Investment Act
